# The 15<sup>th</sup> International Fragrant Rose Trial in Echigo Hillside Park, Nagaoka, Japan Details of the result

The International Fragrant Rose Trials is held every year by inviting applications of new fragrant roses from rose breeders not only in Japan but all around the world. All the applied nursery plants are planted and brought up for two years under exactly the same condition in the snowy and cold region of Japan. Then, examination session is held twice every spring and autumn by the Judging Committee comprising of experts of roses and fragrances to decide the award winning varieties.

The winning prizes are Gold Award, Silver Award and Bronze Award each for the specified four criteria. In addition, as special awards, Minister of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism Award is presented to the highest score winner among the Gold Award Winners, Niigata Prefectural Governor's Award is presented to the highest score winner in the fragrance section among the winners of Gold, Silver and Bronze Awards, and Nagaoka City Mayor's Award is presented to the most popular variety among the general guests to the park.

#### **Judging Committee Chairman:**

#### Yoshihiro Ueda (Visiting Professor, Gifu International Academy of Horticulture)

We received a total of 49 entries in the 15th International Fragrant Rose Trials, with 22 Hybrid Tea (HT) entries, 14 Floribunda (F) entries, 11 Shrub (S) entries, and 2 entries in the Miniature (Min) category, characterized by many entries in the HT category. This year, we experienced a severe weather condition for the roses with an unusually long period of rain in August after the end of the rainy season followed by lingering summer heat. For roses grown under these conditions, we awarded one Gold, one Silver, and one Bronze for each of the HT, F, and S categories, and one Bronze for the Miniature category. In addition, the Nagaoka City Mayor's Award was awarded to the one selected from the S category by popular vote of the park visitors.

Partner was the Gold Award winner in the S category and the recipient of the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism Award. It is a variety with rosette blooms that transition from apricot to coral-pink in color and has an unprecedented characteristic of high resistance to rain, heat and cold

*Perfume Dress*, the Gold Award winner in the HT category, is a beautiful and striking variety with semi-sharp petal blooms of a gentle pink with a hint of blue.

Aya, the Gold Award winner in the F category, is a generous bloom variety with quartered reddishpurple rosette and received high scores in fragrance. Strawberry Swing was the winner of the Niigata Prefecture Governor's Award and the Silver Award in the F category. It is a variety with pale-pink, round-petal, plump cup blooms and received high scores in fragrance in terms of both strength and quality.

*Hazy Moon* in the S category, the winner of the Nagaoka City Mayor's Award, is a variety with lemonyellow rosette blooms transitioning to quartered blooms. It was most popular among the park visitors most likely due to the refreshing color and the gorgeousness of the flowers.

#### << Prize Winner Details and Judges' Comments >>

#### Judging Committee Deputy Chairman: Yuji Ichikawa (Perfumer)

We received a total of 49 entries from Japan and overseas for the 15th International Fragrant Rose Trials. This year, although the low temperatures in early spring and the prolonged rains and lingering heat in summer were severe, we were blessed with relatively good weather in autumn. As a result, as with last year, we were able to select a total of 11 award-winning varieties in four categories: three Golds, three Silver, four Bronze, and one Nagaoka City Award.

Partner was the winner of the Gold Award in the Shrub category and the Minister of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism Award for the highest overall score. It has a fruity fragrance described as "an impressive fruity fragrance with peach and apricot notes and an elegantly sweet black tea leave-like aroma."

Aya, the winner of the Gold Award in the Floribunda category, has a fruity fragrance described as "a fruity fragrance with prominent peach and apple notes on top of a honey-like sweet Damask fragrance." Strawberry Swing was the winner of the Silver Award also in the Floribunda category and the Niigata Prefecture Governor's Award for the highest score in the fragrance category. It has a Damask-Modern fragrance described as "a Damask fragrance based on a fruity fragrance with blackcurrant-like acidity, balanced with a calming black tea leave-like aroma and a honey-like sweetness."

*Perfume Dress*, the Gold Award winner in the Hybrid Tea category, has a Damask-Modern fragrance described as "a gorgeous Damask fragrance with a good blend of a clove-like spicy aroma and a honey-like sweet aroma."

This year, there was no entry worthy of the Gold Award in the Miniature category.

Finally, *Hazy Moon* in the Shrub category, which won the Nagaoka City Mayor's Award by popular vote, has a black tea fragrance described as "an expansive black tea fragrance with a harmonious blend of a pineapple-like fruity aroma and an anise-like aroma characterized by greenish sweetness."

sweet aroma.

Fragrance type : Damask-Classic

A Damask fragrance with an apple-like fruity aroma and a refreshing hyacinth green aroma.

Flower: White with a touch of soft pink, high-centered, sharp petal blooms. The leaves are glossy and

thick.

Fragrance type: Myrrh

A myrrh fragrance with an elegant black tea leave-like aroma and an anise-like aroma characterized by greenish sweetness.

Flower: A beautiful white rose with a touch of pale pink, round-petal, medium cup blooms.

The stamens are red.

Fragrance type: Myrrh

A myrrh fragrance based on a Damask fragrance with a honey-like sweetness, blended with a stimulating anise-like aroma.

# The 15<sup>th</sup> International Fragrant Rose Trial in Echigo Hillside Park, Nagaoka, Japan (Echigo-IFRT)

- ◆Guidelines for Applications
  - 1. Eligibility for Applications: Breeders both professional and amateur, in Japan and overseas.
  - 2. Acceptable Rose Varieties:
    - (1) Varieties that have never been on the market within or outside Japan, or varieties that were first made available for sale on or after January 1, 2016.
    - (2) Categories of Acceptable Rose Varieties:

Part 1: Large-flowered Roses (HTs, Grandifloras)

Part 2: Floribunda Roses (F) (to be the family of "cluster-flowered roses")

Part 3: Shrubs(S)

Part 4: Miniature Roses, Mini-floras, Patio Roses, and Polyanthas(Min)

Climbers are excluded from any of the above categories.

- (3) The Number of Entries: Limited to a total of four varieties per single breeder.
- (4) The Number of Trees per Variety:

For each variety, three 2-to-3-year-old bare-root trees, either budded, grafted, or self-rooted.
