The 16th International Fragrant Rose Trial in Echigo Hillside Park, Nagaoka, Japan Details of the result

The International Fragrant Rose Trials is held every year by inviting applications of new fragrant roses from rose breeders not only in Japan but all around the world. All the applied nursery plants are planted and brought up for two years under exactly the same condition in the snowy and cold region of Japan. Then, examination session is held twice every spring and autumn by the Judging Committee comprising of experts of roses and fragrances to decide the award winning varieties.

The winning prizes are Gold Award, Silver Award and Bronze Award each for the specified four criteria. In addition, as special awards, Minister of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism Award is presented to the highest score winner among the Gold Award Winners, Niigata Prefectural Governor's Award is presented to the highest score winner in the fragrance section among the winners of Gold, Silver and Bronze Awards, and Nagaoka City Mayor's Award is presented to the most popular variety among the general guests to the park.

<< Prize Winner Details and Judges' Comments >>

Judging Committee Chairman:

Yoshihiro Ueda (Visiting Professor, Gifu International Academy of Horticulture)

We received a total of 59 entries in the 16th International Fragrant Rose Trials, with 14 Hybrid Tea (HT) entries, 19 Floribunda (F) entries, 24 Shrub (S) entries, and 2 entries in the Miniature (Min) category, characterized by many entries in the S category. This year, although we experienced heavy winter snowfall and delayed snowmelt, roses grew steadily and flowered well in the spring. There was some effect on the fall flowering due to the high temperature and dryness of summer, but did not cause any difficulty with the judging. For roses grown under these conditions, we awarded one Gold, one Silver, and one Bronze for each of the HT, F, and S categories, and one Silver and one Bronze for the Min category. In addition, the Nagaoka City Mayor's Award was awarded to the one selected from the HT category by popular vote of the park visitors.

Le Temps des Cerises was the Gold Award winner in the S category and the recipient of the Minister of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism Award. It is a highly vigorous variety with vivid burgundy, cupped to rosette blossoms.

Jolie Melodie was the Gold Award winner in the HT category and the recipient of the Niigata Prefectural Governor's Award. It is the most fragrant variety with reddish-purple, low, high-centered round-petal to cupped blossoms.

Champagne, the Gold Award winner in the F category, is a strong-growth, generous blossom variety with butter-yellow, peony-like appearance, rosette to quartered blossoms.

ELEANOR, the Silver Award winner in the Min category, is a little large variety for a miniature rose, with wisteria-purple, shallow-cup blossoms of which periphery of petals turn dark pink at full bloom.

GisilaTM Renaissance Poulren042(N) in the HT category, the winner of the Nagaoka City Mayor's Award, forms lemon-yellow, large rosette blossoms. Its color and refreshing fragrance probably made it most popular among the park visitors.

Judging Committee Deputy Chairman: Yuji Ichikawa (Perfumer)

We received a total of 59 entries from Japan and overseas for the 16th International Fragrant Rose Trials. This year, we had long rainy days and severe temperature fluctuations during the summer and fall, but overall, the weather was relatively good. As a result, we were able to select a total of 12 award-winning roses in 4 categories: 3 Gold, 4 Silver, 4 Bronze, and one Nagaoka City Mayor's Award, which were tied for the most awards to date.

The fragrance category of award-winning roses was 6 Damask-modern, 4 Tea, 1 Fruity and 1 Blue categories.

Jolie Melodie was the winner of the Gold Award in the Hybrid Tea category and the Niigata Prefectural Governor's Award for the highest score in the fragrance category. It has a Damask-modern fragrance described as "a gorgeous Damask fragrance characterized by sparkling pear, lychee, and smooth tea notes."

Champagne, the winner of the Gold Award in the Floribunda category, has a tea fragrance described as "an elegant tea fragrance of fresh orange, apple, peach aromas with honey-like sweetness in harmony."

Le Temps des Cerises was the winner of the Gold Award in the Shrub category and the Minister of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism Award for the highest overall score. It has a Damask-modern fragrance described as "a deep Damask fragrance of clear lychee aroma with soft tea aroma and honey-like sweetness in harmony."

This year, there was no entry worthy of the Gold Award in the Miniature category.

Finally, *GisilaTM Renaissance* Poulren042(N) in the Hybrid Tea category won the Nagaoka City Mayor's Award by popular vote. It has a tea fragrance described as "a typical tea fragrance with fresh lemon and violet-green notes."

 - 1. Eligibility for Applications: Breeders both professional and amateur, in Japan and overseas.
 - 2. Acceptable Rose Varieties:
 - (1) Varieties that have never been on the market within or outside Japan, or varieties that were first made available for sale on or after January 1, 2017.
 - (2) Categories of Acceptable Rose Varieties:

Part 1: Large-flowered Roses (HTs, Grandifloras)

Part 2: Floribunda Roses (F) (Cluster-flowered)

Part 3: Shrubs(S)

Part 4: Miniature Roses, Mini-floras, Patio Roses, and Polyanthas(Min)

Climbers are excluded from all of the above categories.

- (3) The Number of Entries: Limited to a total of four varieties per single breeder.
- (4) The Number of Trees per Variety:

Three trees per single variety.

Note: Includes grafted rootstock up to 3-yrs old. Excludes custom shaped or trained roses such as standard roses.
